ABOUT BAYOU PRESERVATION ASSOCIATION

- **Mission:** to celebrate, protect and restore the natural richness of all our bayous and streams.
- **Vision:** a network of healthy bayous, streams and watersheds.
- **Four key programs** to accomplish its mission:
 - bayou appreciation,
 - bayou citizen science,
 - clean bayous, and
 - stream corridor restoration.
- **Goals:**
 - To increase understanding of area bayous and creeks and their watersheds by providing educational programs and opportunities, activities and events to engage all the region’s demographics.
 - To expand stewardship and stewardship opportunities to improve the health of our watersheds and bayous.

THE OPPORTUNITY

This is an opportunity to be part of a team shaping a long-standing environmental organization as it moves forward in strengthening its capacity and accomplishments. Board members will support the work of Bayou Preservation and provide mission-based leadership and strategic governance. While day-to-day operations are led by Bayou Preservation’s President and Chief Executive Officer (CEO), the Board-CEO relationship is a partnership, and the appropriate involvement of the Board is both critical and expected.

Specific Board Member responsibilities include:

LEADERSHIP, GOVERNANCE & OVERSIGHT

- Serving as a trusted advisor to the CEO as they implement and improve upon Bayou Preservation’s Fy23-Fy26 strategic plan
- Reviewing outcomes and metrics created by Bayou Preservation for evaluating its impact, and regularly measuring its performance and effectiveness using those metrics; reviewing agenda and supporting materials prior to Board and committee meetings
- Approving the organization’s annual budget, audit reports, and material business decisions; being informed of, and meeting all legal and fiduciary responsibilities
- Partnering with the CEO and other Board members to ensure that Board resolutions are carried out
- Serving on committees or task forces and taking on special assignments
- Representing Bayou Preservation to stakeholders; acting as an ambassador for the organization
- Ensuring organization maintains a commitment to a diverse Board and staff that reflects the communities we serve

FUNDRAISING

- Bayou Preservation Board Members will consider Bayou Preservation a philanthropic priority and make annual gifts that reflect that priority. So that Bayou Preservation can credibly solicit contributions from foundations, organizations, and individuals.
- Bayou Preservation expects to have 100 percent of Board Members make an annual contribution that is commensurate with their capacity.
- Board members are expected to solicit support for the mission, and conduct fundraising on our behalf to colleagues, businesses, foundations, etc.

BOARD TERMS & PARTICIPATION

- Bayou Preservation’s Board Members serve a three-year term and may serve for up to two consecutive terms, with a maximum of six years.
- Board meetings will be held quarterly (usually on the third Tuesday from 12 pm – 1:30 pm via Microsoft Teams);
- Board terms are anticipated to begin following the November election.
- Board Members must be able to support the organization’s mission, vision, and abide by the Bylaws of the Corporation.
- Board Members must be able to attend a two-hour orientation following the November election.
- Service on Bayou Preservation’s Board of Directors is without remuneration, except as described by the Bylaws of the Corporation and allowed by non-profit law in the State of Texas.

QUALIFICATIONS

This is an extraordinary opportunity for an individual who is passionate about Bayou Preservation’s mission and who has a track record of leadership. Selected Board Members will have achieved leadership stature in business, government, philanthropy or the non-profit sector. Their accomplishments will allow them to attract other well-qualified, high-performing Board Members.

Ideal candidates will have the following qualifications:

- Extensive professional experience with significant executive leadership accomplishments in business, governance, law, philanthropy or the for-profit sector
- A commitment to and understanding of Bayou Preservation’s mission, preferably based on experience.
- Savvy diplomatic skills and a natural affinity for cultivating relationships and persuading, convening, facilitating and building consensus among diverse individuals
- Personal qualities of integrity, credibility and a passion for improving the lives of Bayou Preservation’s beneficiaries (the bayous and citizens of our region’s watersheds)
